Hello family and friends,

I would like to give you a short update on my recent endeavors. In obedience to the Lord, I moved to Maui, HI on January 21, 2008. Upon arrival I started working construction (in a normal forty hour week schedule) and continued to do so over the last two and a half months until now. Although, I knew that construction work was not my long-term calling, I knew that it was my call for this short season of my life. It has been amazing to see all the many ways the Lord has been enabling me to be used on the job sight in ways that I never even thought possible. I have been able to pray for co-workers and plant seeds of truth in their lives. I have been growing so much in the Lord over this time! God has been showing me a lot about his love and mercy towards all people, as well as in the areas of provision over my own life. I have been extremely blessed ever since the first day I set foot on the island of Maui. God has provided in every way possible, from a job, to a place to live, to getting connected with a good church family, and being able to be used for His kingdom. .

I believe it is my calling to preach and teach the Word of God and to go out to many nations. I also know that I am called into the fulltime ministry as we may classify it in the "fivefold ministry" of Ephesians 4.

I would like to give a special thanks to all my prayer and financial supporters!!!

Starting this week of April 14, 2008, I will begin a YWAM (Youth With A Mission) school called "School of Biblical Foundations and Missions" (SBFM) on the Maui base (a sister campus of University of the Nations). It is a school designed to help train young people like myself, to be firmly rooted and established in the Word of God, in order to go out to non-believing countries and people groups, in order to effectively bring the gospel. It is an intense three month course that primarily involves Bible doctrine, apologetics, personal formation, skills formation, and will challenge our minds to think critically in determining truth. I truly believe that this school will help further equip me for the mission field and any other future ministry opportunities that lie ahead of me. I also believe that this school is very key in preparing me for such endeavors. But in order to do it I need your help. I am trying to raise another \$1,800 for the completion of tuition of this three month course. Project CURE (Cure Urban and Rural Ethiopia)

A project under TEAM International (A non-profit organization).

Project CURE was created in hopes that it would partner with already established Ethiopian organizations and churches in order to enable them to reach their goals of curing and healing the land of Ethiopia. This will primarily be done through evangelism, church planting, expanding orphanages and planting new ones, and providing medical and care centers for those who suffer from HIV/AIDS. Project CURE is also interested in creating new “grassroots” ways to help cure the land of Ethiopia, as resources, ideas and capabilities become available.

Ethiopia’s needs:

I. Addis Ababa

A) **Orphaned Children:** The UN Children’s Fund (UNICEF) estimates there are more than 100,000 street children in Addis Ababa, with 600,000 around the country.

1) Ways to help

a) Support YWAM Mercy Development so they can provide for more children to get off the street and into a loving Christian environment with food, shelter, clothing, schooling, and Biblical teaching and discipleship. As well, provide for more materials (clothes, books, etc.) and human support (teachers, spiritual fathers/mothers, maintenance, and construction).

II. Awassa

A) **Orphaned children**

B) **Evangelism**

C) **Church Planting**

D) **Discipleship**

E) **HIV/AIDS:** There are between 420,000-1,300,000 people living with HIV/AIDS, and an estimated 30,000-220,000 being children, with an estimated 280,000-870,000 orphans due to HIV/AIDS. <http://www.avert.org/subadults.htm>

1) Ways to help

a) Partner with Pastor Benyam’s vision with his church and ministry*:

*Around 2,000 people will listen the gospel through mass and one on one evangelism. One year goal: 1,000 people come to know the Lord and 500 people in salvation classes. Estimated amount for evangelism: \$650 USD (5,200 Birr)

*Disciple new believers through continuous teaching (rural area). 16 Evangelists (full time ministers) in rural areas and 6 evangelists with 1 pastor. Support discipleship for the existing two local churches in Awassa and 13 churches in rural areas. Estimated amount for discipleship: \$1,875 USD (15,000 birr).

*Training the congregation (Church) on different topics four times in a year for two days. Ex.: marriage, ministry, HIV-AIDS. Estimated amount for training: \$ 650USD (5,200 birr)

*Giving basic bible training course for evangelist, full time ministers and preachers which will take one year. Estimated amount for materials, books, and training is \$650 USD (5,200 birr)

*Establishing a mercy Center for those directly affected by HIV/AIDS. Estimated amount for a mercy center: \$ 4,375 USD (35,000 birr)

*Establishing an orphanage for parentless children for those who are unable to go to school. Teaching the word of God and assisting their physical needs, (eg. clothes, food, educational materials). Estimated amount needed: \$ 4,375 USD (35,000 birr)

*Buying a plot of land to build a permanent worship building (ministry headquarters for all other ministries). Estimated amount of money for land and building: \$40,000USD (320,000birr)

*Total amount needed to accomplish the whole vision for one year is \$ 52,575USD (420,600 birr)

PROJECT CURE Outreach 2008

Primary goal: To reconnect with the Ethiopian people and designated ministries, in order to discern the best way to use our resources in a way that will best help Ethiopia's physical and spiritual needs. As well, to find new areas of need that we could possibly help with in the future (ex. water wells, crops, nutrition, hygiene, etc.)

Summary Outline (subject to change)

I. In Ethiopia: June-July (dates will be adjusted)

A) Live at YWAM base in Addis Ababa (will be our main missionary headquarters).

1) while in Addis Ababa

a) connect with YWAM orphanage

i) help with teaching English and the Bible to the children

ii) repair any maintenance needs (plumbing, yard work, housing repairs, etc.)

iii) discuss with orphanage leader, Abdissa Muleta about future plans for expanding and bettering the orphanage. How can we help?

b) minister to the local churches with preaching and teaching. Find new needs.

B) Visit Awassa (about 4 hour ride from Addis Ababa)

1) while in Awassa

a) connect with Pastor Benyam and discuss his vision and plan and how we can partner with him and his ministry.

b) minister to the local churches with preaching and teaching. Find new needs.

C) Visit Mojo (about 2 hours from Addis Ababa)

1) while in Mojo

a) connect with the church and school there

i) minister to church with preaching and teaching.

ii) teach at grade school English classes.

iii) discuss with pastor about evangelism goals and ministry goals. How can we help? Any new needs?

D) Debrief in Addis Ababa. Discuss experience, as well discuss what we can do when we get home to motivate others to help achieve our goals in Ethiopia (project CURE and TEAM International, home churches, family, friends, other organizations, etc.)

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
